Interview with Engr. Clement Adeyinka Oke FNSE on Electricity Power Reform

Engr. Clement Adeyinka Oke FNSE, is the Head, Performance Monitoring Team on Fuel-to-Power, Presidential Task Force on Power, in the Presidency.

E-Newsletter: Sir, what can you tell us about Power Reform in the country.

Engr. Oke: Let me say that in the Power Reform, the Government has successfully moved the power business from the government to the private sector, except for the transmission which is still been held by the government. The expectation is that the performance of the industry will improve especially now that we are moving into cost effect tariff and the billing system.
